### My time with LETS in Galway, Ireland by Sally

Good friends of mine, Bella, and Neil Walker came to stay for some months and with them I joined the Galway city Lets group. They had a name for their units, and they were named after the local river, so they traded in Corribs. I offered cakes and cookies, as well as meditation classes in a series of three on a weekly basis.

The first trade day we went to was held just a short walk for me and Bella, with Neil too. We had prepared all types of biscuits, muffins, cakes, and other desserts and carried them with us. Irish folk are pretty down to earth and open, and we actually sold out of all our sweets that evening!! Plus, one of the organisers had a birthday coming up and requested a cake and some other desserts too. It was fun to meet the others at Lets, and I met all the needs of requests for sweets. A lady called Kerry ran the Galway city Lets and she came to my meditation classes, and I hosted their meetings number of times in my lounge room when they had nowhere to meet.

I found there wasn't much to spend my corribs on, as Galway is a transient place, people came from worldwide, joined the Lets and then left! So, when Patri and I, were leaving we gifted the 80 corribs back into the Lets system. Kerry was amazed and thankful, we gifted some of our property too to the Lets team. That was my first Lets experience and it was a really good time!
